**ACACIA SUBSIDIARY, SAINT LAWRENCE, AWARDED VERDICT OF WILLFULL  
PATENT INFRINGEMENT IN CASE AGAINST MOTOROLA**

Newport Beach, Calif. – (BUSINESS WIRE) March 28, 2017 – [Acacia Research Corporation](http://www.acaciaresearch.com) (NASDAQ: ACTG) announced that its subsidiary Saint Lawrence Communications LLC received a jury verdict in its case against MOTOROLA, Inc. in lead case number 2:15-cv-00349 pending in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Texas. The jury returned a verdict that five U.S. patents were valid and infringed. The jury found the infringement was willful and returned a damages award of nearly \$9.2M for past infringement.
